



On the following pages we have selected a few of our favourite destinations that you'll get to experience on your World Cruise.



South America

Pisco, Penguins & Machu Picchu

Blend the ruins of Machu Picchu with the iconic Panama Canal and the exotic Galápagos Islands too for South America cruising that will leave you spellbound. The metropolises, museums and markets you'll uncover are a cocktail of rich history, contemporary flair and nature.



The Panama Canal

Often called the 'Eighth Wonder of the World', the Panama Canal is one of earth's greatest engineering marvels, stretching 48 miles across the continental divide from Panama City to Colón. *Black Watch* will take you on a journey through three great locks – being lifted and lowered in excess of 170 feet in the process – and crossing Gatún Lake, which is surrounded by untouched, dense rainforest.

Manta, Ecuador

On a call into the bustling seafaring port of Manta, explore the seaside promenade and beaches, or uncover Ecuadorean history in the Banco Central Museum. Nearby you'll find the town of Montecristi, home of the Panama Hat, while tours can take you to Machalilla National Park, inhabited by waved albatross, armadillos and monkeys, or the tropical Pacoche Forest, bursting with flora and fauna. For a real adventure, experience an incredible train ride down the rocky slopes of the Andes on our optional overland tour.

Recommended experience: The Enchanted Galápagos Islands

Step into David Attenborough's shoes during an overland adventure to the Galápagos Islands. It's an open-air wildlife museum with an extraordinary variety of endemic species, including land tortoises and penguins.

Callao, Peru

Callao is the gateway to the Peruvian capital, Lima. Full of unexpected pleasures, the 'City of Kings' is home to two museums giving two very different insights into South American history. The Gold Museum displays countless

gold, silver and copper articles, while the world's largest private collection of pre-Colombian art can be found in the Larco Herrera Museum. Elsewhere, you can browse the colourful, bustling stalls of the Indian Market, indulge in a Pisco Sour – one of the most difficult cocktails to master – or tour the ancient ruins of Pachacamac.

Recommended experience: CUSCO & Machu Picchu Overland Adventure

Discover the cultural side of Cusco before unlocking the mysteries of Machu Picchu. This breathtaking, historic site was the seed that blossomed into the isolated yet great Inca civilisation. Today it stands as one of the New Seven Wonders of the World.

General San Martín, Peru

Named after José de San Martín – the general who led Peru to independence from Spain in 1820/21 – General San Martín is a thriving deepwater port. Take a tour to discover the production methods of Pisco, the Peruvian brandy; enjoy the energising ride of a lifetime on a dune buggy across golden sands; or visit the nearby Paracas National Reserve. This magnificent, protected area of coastal desert is teeming with wildlife, from orcas and sea lions, to flamingos and blue-footed boobies.

Recommended experience: Ballestas Islands

Discover the beautiful, volcanic islands of Ballestas, often referred to as Peru's Galápagos. Admire the dramatic scenery and keep your eyes peeled for the wonderful local wildlife.





New Zealand

Mud-pools, Maoris & Middle Earth

Cruising around New Zealand offers a mesmerising medley of three charismatic cities, followed by stunning scenic cruising, courtesy of the enchanting sounds – Dusky, Doubtful and Milford. Picturesque waterfronts, natural splendours and Maori culture await your discovery.



Auckland

Built on a volcanic field consisting of over 40 extinct volcanoes, this is a unique city in a unique location. The boutiques and chic cafés of Ponsonby Road, the charming beachside area of Mission Bay, and the surrounding natural landscapes should all be high on your list. Auckland is also home to the tallest structure in the Southern Hemisphere – the Sky Tower – and has more boats per head of population than any other city in the world, earning it the nickname, the ‘City of Sails’. A great way to appreciate the beautiful harbour is from a 65-foot America’s Cup sailing yacht, while a short ferry ride to Waiheke Island is the perfect opportunity for wine tasting and relaxing on unspoiled beaches.

Recommended experience: Waitomo Glowworm Caves

Explore these fascinating caves and their limestone formations before taking a silent boat ride along a magical underground river. As you enter the cavern, the ceiling twinkles like a starry night sky, with the luminescent light radiated by thousands of glowworms.

Tauranga

Tauranga is vibrant and attractive, with many walking routes that showcase the gorgeous local scenery. A hike to the top of Mount Maunganui affords fabulous views, while at the base lie the thermal Mount Hot Pools. The city is the gateway to Rotorua, an area at the heart of Maori culture, known for geothermal activity. Enjoy an authentic Maori ‘hangi’ lunch, watch a Haka performance, and observe bursting geysers and bubbling mud pools. What a way to spend a day!

Recommended experience: The Hobbiton Movie Set

Step into JRR Tolkien’s Middle Earth on a visit

to the movie set of *The Hobbit* and *The Lord of the Rings* trilogies. See Bilbo Baggins’ house, hobbit holes, The Green Dragon Inn and more, while taking in the spectacular green rolling hills and beautiful gardens.

Wellington

Known for its picturesque natural harbour and pretty hillsides dotted with colonial villas, Wellington is one of the world’s most beautiful capital cities. The fascinating national museum of New Zealand, Te Papa, is definitely worth a visit – and general admission is free. Head to bohemian Cuba Street for vintage shops and street entertainers; take a stroll along the attractive waterfront; and relax on Oriental Beach with a hokey pokey ice-cream. Be sure to take a ride on the historic cable car; the views over the city are magnificent.

Recommended experience: Zealandia Eco Reserve

Zealandia is a nature lover’s dream. See rare and native wildlife living in a protected sanctuary valley, set around a beautiful reservoir, and discover New Zealand’s natural history in an engaging exhibition.

Fiordland

With snow-capped mountain peaks, tumbling waterfalls and mesmeric waters, Fiordland’s spectacular scenery is a must-see for any visitor to New Zealand. *Black Watch* will take you on an unforgettable journey along the stunning Dusky, Doubtful and Milford sounds, which cut their way into the southwest coast of the South Island. Marvel at the breathtaking vistas from the comfort of your home-from-home, keeping a lookout for Fur Seals, Bottlenose Dolphins and Crested Penguins too.






Egypt

Temples, Tombs & Tutankhamun

Ancient Egyptian civilisation takes pride of place in history; there are seemingly endless wonders here. Uncover temples, tombs, museums and lasting legacies at your own pace or take advantage of the superb location as you snorkel, swim or simply soak up the sun until your heart is content.



Safaga

Safaga fuses ancient Egyptian history with a sublime holiday heaven. Enjoy lunch aboard a traditional Felucca sailboat, or uncover the mystical temples of Luxor and Karnak. Alternatively, the city of Hurghada and the granite quarry of Mons Claudianus await your discovery. For true relaxation, the surrounding Red Sea is renowned as a haven for snorkelers, windsurfers and sun-worshippers alike.

Recommended experience: **Discover the Valley of the Kings**

Embark on a memorable exploration of the Land of the Pharaohs and discover the mysteries behind the elaborate and intricate tombs within the Valley of the Kings.

Sharm el-Sheikh

Sharm el-Sheikh is deservedly one of Egypt's most popular resorts, appearing like a mirage across endless sands. Take the chance to snorkel or swim the crystal-clear waters and coral reefs at Ras Mohammed Park or Naama Bay; discover the 6th century St. Catherine's Monastery, set in the shadow of Mount Sinai – where it is believed Moses received the Ten Commandments; or simply unwind on a sandy beach or two.

Recommended experience: **Glass-Bottom Boat Cruise**

Admire the underwater wonders of the Red

Sea from the comfort of a glass-bottom boat. Discover what lies beneath, from tropical fish to colourful coral formations.

The Suez Canal

Transit the marvel of engineering that is the Suez Canal. At 101 miles long, this impressive man-made waterway crosses the Isthmus of Suez, which divides the Mediterranean from the Red Sea. Opened in 1869, it remains one of the world's busiest shipping lanes.

Alexandria

Once Egypt's greatest city and the birthplace of Cleopatra VII, magnificent Alexandria is drenched in a fascinating history that can be uncovered in the National Museum. The Roman amphitheatre, ancient catacombs and the site of the great Pharos Lighthouse – one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World – are legacies of a distant past. The 19th century Montazah Palace and seafront boulevards reflect a more recent era. This sparkling gem on the Mediterranean coast is sure to impress.

Recommended experience: **Pyramids of Giza & Lunch on the River Nile**

Visit the enchanting, ancient spectacle of the Pyramids of Giza and the mythical Sphinx before dining at one of Egypt's finest floating restaurants during a relaxing cruise along the Nile.






South Pacific & The Maldives

Palms, Pearls & Paradise Islands

Papeete, Tahiti, French Polynesia

Think Papeete, think Polynesian paradise. The ever-popular Le Marché (daily market) is the heart and soul of the city, a mix of bustling stalls and flourishing flower displays. Towering peaks, tumbling waterfalls and lush valleys form the stunning surroundings. Visit the world's only Pearl Museum, the spring garden of Vaipahi, or simply relax on golden beaches as palm trees gently sway in the breeze.

Recommended experience:

Tahiti Jeep Adventure

Get ready for a thrilling trip by 4x4 into Tahiti's unspoiled interior.

Bora Bora, Society Islands, French Polynesia

Bora Bora features on almost everyone's 'must-visit' list, and it's not hard to see why. Beautiful beaches and swaying palms combine with coral motus (islets) surrounding the famous lagoon. The mesmerising turquoise waters that brim with turtles, sharks, rays and tropical fish make snorkelling and scuba diving epically rewarding, while you'll want to take photos endlessly – be sure to capture Mount Otemanu rising high over the island.

Recommended experience:

Shark & Stingray Encounter

Discover the beauty of Bora Bora's lagoon and

get up close to stingrays and Blacktip sharks on this unforgettable tour.

Rarotonga, Cook Islands

Emulate the exploratory spirit of Captain James Cook, who gave his name to these islands, as you unearth the unspoiled rainforest, rugged mountains and pearly-white beaches of Rarotonga, a blissful idyll that is unrivalled when it comes to escaping the hustle and bustle of the modern world. Embark on a unique experience as you go in search of the unusual Kakerori Bird – found only on Rarotonga.

Recommended experience:

Pa's Eco Tour

Travel through some of the most unspoiled valleys of Rarotonga, guided by a traditional 'Medicine Man' with a vast knowledge of the Cook Islands' culture and traditions.

The Maldives






Australia

Sydney

Sydney is one of the world's most exciting, must-visit modern cities. The Great Barrier Reef

One of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World, the amazing Great Barrier Reef brims with colour and variety. Boasting 400 coral varieties, 1,500 species of tropical fish and crystalline blue water, you are sure to be inspired by viewing this spectacular sight from the comfort of *Black Watch*.

Hamilton Island

One of the 74 Whitsunday Islands, Hamilton Island is in the heart of the Great Barrier Reef, a colourful underwater world teeming with life, which can be explored by catamaran, snorkelling or semi-submersible submarine.

There's an abundance of activities to enjoy on the island, from sailing to go-karting, while tours to the Whitsundays' bushland or Whitehaven Beach – considered to be one of the world's top ten beaches – are unforgettable experiences.

Recommended experience:

Sail the Whitsundays

Soak up the peace and tranquillity during a cruise amongst the paradise islands of the Whitsundays, home to tropical beaches, secluded coves and emerald waters.

Cairns

Tropical, laid-back, yet modern, Cairns is a very enjoyable city to experience. The two kilometre esplanade – lined with cafés, piazzas and many historic buildings – and the beautiful Botanical Gardens are both highlights, while a ride above the rainforest canopy on the Skyrail Cableway rewards with breathtaking views.
