



How do you bring home memories from a Hurtigruten trip in the best possible way?

Imagine for a second that you're already on the ship, with your state-of-the-art camera. It does a lot of things; measures, adjusts and enhances. But there's one thing it doesn't do. Your camera isn't the photographer. You are.

o, how do you get the best photos? How can you let your friends back home best see a glimpse of what you have experienced? Let's hear from esteemed local photographer, Stian Klo. Born and raised in Harstad, he knows just about every square metre of Lofoten. His pictures have been published worldwide for such companies as Apple, Instagram, National Geographic and the BBC.

NATURE ON MY DOORSTEP

'I'm very fortunate to literally have nature on my doorstep. For me, it's a dream to be able to work up here. No two days are alike,' Stian says. 'Sailing with Hurtigruten along the coast of Norway, it is all about the light, or the absence of it. Nothing remains the same for long. The light colours the landscape and villages in a thousand different shades; it wraps them in darkness, or lights them up; it makes them glow in the sunset or throws long, dark shadows towards the shore. From the Hurtigruten ships, you have a great opportunity to experience all of this!' he enthuses.

— Growing up surrounded by this raw and untouched landscape has nurtured in me a deep affection and respect for our precious planet.

LAND OF THE MIDNIGHT SUN' truly lives up to its name from May to July. The intense extended daylight above the Arctic Circle persists around the clock, making every Norwegian 'night' a joy to behold. This natural phenomenon is found in latitudes north of the Arctic Circle, where the sun stavs above the horizon for 24 hours.

THE LIGHT OF THE ETERNAL SUN

'In summer, there are endless hiking possibilities for those feeling adventurous, and it might surprise you to hear that there are pristine sandy beaches to explore in Arctic Norway. It never gets dark, and even at night you can see the sun hanging like a blazing beacon on the horizon, barely grazing the ocean before it begins to rise again. It might make you feel a bit 'jet-lagged' but most of all, you simply feel happy and grateful that you have experienced it, ' Stian says.

The Midnight Sun only occurs north of the Arctic Circle between May and July. That means you can see it along much of Hurtigruten's route in the summer. 'Backlit pictures with the Midnight Sun can be challenging

because you have bright light and shadows at the same time. The trick is to measure the light in the lighter mid tones, not in the highlights nor the shadows, 'Stian advises.

THREE SEASONS IN ONE GO

'When it comes to light and great photo opportunities, I'll let you in on a secret: April! No other time of the year has as much raw nature. The light is never as clear and bright, but you see white mountains against the deep blue fjords. The days are long, but you still have some dramatic red sunsets.

There are great differences between the southern and northern parts of Norway at this time of the year, making a trip with Hurtigruten a smorgasbord of contrasts for photographers. You might travel from a summer climate in Bergen, through spring further north, and into full winter in Kirkenes, where you can still participate in the winter excursions. 'Your pictures will feel like months of travel, not a couple of days,' Stian says enthusiastically.

'Whatever you do, don't leave the deck when it rains,' he urges. 'Rain and hail are actually great conditions for a good photo! If it's raining or snowing at night, you can leave your flash on and use a slow shutter camera app on your smartphone to create streaks. Overcast days can create interesting cloud patterns in the sky, so don't just stay indoors even when the weather isn't perfect.'







STATE-OF-THE-ART cameras or the ubiquitous smartphone? Stian could go on for hours about technical details for taking good photos. The most important rule is to understand a few visual basic precepts:

COMPOSITION. Travelling along the coast, you have plenty of motifs, but a picture stands or falls by its composition.


RULE OF THIRDS. This standard rule perceives images as divided into nine equal parts by two horizontal lines and two vertical lines. According to the rule, the important elements in the composition should be placed along these lines or at their intersections.

OFF CENTRE. Scientific studies have identified that when looking at images, viewers' eyes are usually more naturally drawn to one of the line intersections rather than the centre of the image.

TILT OR NOT TILT. Generally speaking, avoid tilting the horizon in a photograph. It can be annoying to look at and it's not really dynamic. If you want to tilt the horizon, make it clear it's intentional.

FROM A DISTANCE. Photographing from a distance, your picture may end up with nothing but background. Try using perspective by including something in the foreground with a familiar size, like people, ships or houses.

VANTAGE POINTS. Last, but not least, get to know the ship by walking around. Find the sweet spots. Look for options. A good composition is often about moving into the right place.





COLOURS OF THE COAST

`And then there is autumn, when you can watch the coastline shift colours from one season to another over the course of a single day. This is also a great time for photography. The clear air enhances the red and yellow hues that fill the mountainsides, hilltops and woods. From a photographic perspective, the scenery is perfect, framed by an icy blue sky and the sprinklings of early snow on the highest peaks. The darkness comes gradually and the sun sets earlier and earlier. If you are lucky, the Northern Lights will appear and perform their act of visual magic,' Stian muses.

`The easiest way to optimise the subjects of your photo is to think carefully about

lighting in the shot. If you want a photo from your ship to have the depth of colours you see in holiday brochures, take the picture on the sunny side of the ship. Alternatively, if you want to catch the glistening of light on the ocean, take the photo when the sun is low enough to bounce off the waves.

DEEP BLUE ARCTIC LIGHT

'During the polar nights, the sun completely disappears below the horizon, and only a vague glimmer of light separates day from night. As a photographer, I really love this "blue hour" – it is the short period of time on winter afternoons when the whole landscape appears bathed in a deep blue colour. In win-

ter, because the light changes, the scenery changes too. If you stay out on deck for 30 minutes, the ocean, the mountains, the sky, and the landscape change completely.

`Low light can be tricky to photograph, so capture your images in the RAW format. This provides you the greatest flexibility in post-production and allows you to easily fix problems that would otherwise be harder, if not impossible, to correct if shooting in JPEG. Bring along extra memory cards to accommodate the increased image file size, 'Stian suggests.

THE MAGICAL NORTHERN LIGHTS

Winter comes, and so do the Northern Lights. It is like a canvas of light being pulled across the sky, and the silence of this astral phenomenon can be really quite eerie. Sailing with Hurtigruten provides the best chances to experience this magical light show as you are out at sea, far from the light pollution common on land. Even though I have seen the Northern Lights many, many times, I am still mesmerised every time I see this natural light phenomenon, especially when reflected in the waves below, 'Stian says.

The Northern Lights are a breathtaking experience, but most pictures tend to look alike.

'When you are planning to photograph the Northern Lights on a Hurtigruten ship, there are a few key elements to think about. You'll already be away from the ambient light on land, but try and get away from any source of light pollution or crowds out on the ship's decks. Since the ship is moving, you need to use a sturdy tripod or mono-pod and a fast lens. Use a high ISO value in order to keep the shutter speeds as fast as possible; set your lens to infinity focus and fire away. If the image is too dark, increase the shutter speed or ISO value until you are happy with the exposure.'

'Lastly, if you are shooting on the deck of a moving boat – do not be afraid of bumping up the ISO value to maintain the fastest shutter speed that your camera allows.'

If you are anything like me, I would rather have a sharp image with a little bit of "noise" in it, than an unsharp image. The reason why is simple: I can easily remove "noise" from the image when post-processing. This is very important if you are photographing wildlife. If your camera or lens has an IS feature, be sure to use it when you are shooting handheld. This will result in sharper images and in the end, a happy photographer, 'Stian concludes.

STIAN'S TOP NORTHERN LIGHTS PHOTOGRAPHY TIPS



Bring a tripod. Battling with the Arctic climate, high sea or winds, you will need a really sturdy tripod. For extended exposures on deck, a tripod is a must!



It's vital that your camera, lenses, and filters are clean. Keep at least one cloth in every jacket so you can clean anything swiftly. Storing everything in a water-resistant backpack is also very handy.



Have the right clothes, shoes, and gear! If you intend to shoot the Northern Lights from deck all night, it is imperative to wear proper, i.e. warm, thermal clothing.



Extra batteries. When it's cold outside – and Northern Norway quite often is – batteries lose their charge much quicker, even when inactive. Keep your spare batteries within your clothing rather than any bags, as your body heat will keep them "alive" much longer.



FOR SMARTPHONE USERS

I recommend using earplugs for shutter release. If you plug them in and open the camera app and press the volume button, you'll be able to take photos without physically touching the phone, thus creating less camera shake and increasing the chances of getting a sharp image.



Download the "Slow Shutter Cam" app in the App store. By default, smartphones do not support long-exposure photography, but with this app there's a way around it. Open the app and make sure to go into settings and set picture quality to the highest position and turn on the volume shutter position and turn on the volume shutter.

'Fresh local food enhances the travel experience, generates

positive ripple effects in the local communities and inspires great stories about the places we visit. Imagine sitting in the restaurant eating lamb while we sail past the meadows where the sheep had grazed. The story behind the food is part of the culinary experience. For example, during autumn we serve cloudberries out on deck. A lady in Finnmark handpicks these berries and delivers them to our ships. Experiences don't get more real than this. You also have the possibility to buy some of these products in our on-board shop and take them home with you. This way, the experience lasts longer - and that is what Hurtigruten is all about,' Larsen says smiling.

From 2018, nine out of our 11 ships along the Norwegian coast have an Expedition Leader, an expedition team and special activities on board like lectures and presentations, guiding out on deck, gatherings and environmental actions. These ships function as a 'base camp' - the place where you sleep, eat and share experiences - and they are the starting point for all our onshore activities.

Making the inaccessible accessible

During the summer months, you can join our explorer boats for guided nature and culture tours to sites of special interest in the area around Tromsø and Trondheim. These are special small boats that are made to bring you close to the coast and let you explore hidden, less accessible places, all in the spirit of 'friluftsliv' and adventure. 

City view

You won't find a better view of Bergen than from atop Mt. Fløyen. Few cities in the world can boast a cityscape nestled between seven mountains and the sea. Ride the Fløibanen Funicular from the city to the summit. Another good option is taking the cable car, or hiking, to the top of 643-metre high Mt. Ulriken for a more expansive view of the city and surrounding area.





WHAT TO SEE

BRYGGEN: Experience medieval history among the old Hanseatic buildings.

THE FLØIBANEN FUNICULAR: Enjoy spectacular views of the city from atop Mount Fløyen.

FANTOFT STAVE CHURCH: Explore ancient

architecture combining pagan and Christian beliefs. **THE FISH MARKET:** Smell the sea breeze and fresh delicacies of the deep.

TROLDHAUGEN: Visit the home of composer Edvard Grieg.

THE AQUARIUM: Experience life under water. **OLD BERGEN MUSEUM:** An open-air museum and reminder of what Bergen was like in the 1700s and 1800s.



MORE THAN A MEAL

On board the ship, you can pamper your taste buds. We sail right over one of the world's most abundant sources of seafood – the Norwegian Sea. Using fresh seasonal ingredients, our chefs create delicious three-course dinners and bountiful buffets. We cooperate with local purveyors all along the Norwegian coast and inland Norway, so that nature's pantry is fully stocked with delicacies. Come and taste Norway's Coastal Kitchen.





— Wake up early to see Hornelen (860 metres above sea level) and the landscape of Nordfjord. As we sail past the West Cape, we cross the open sea for the first time during the voyage.

The ship navigates through skerries and islands before reaching the Art Nouveau town of Ålesund. In summer, we sail towards what is often considered to be Norway's jewel in the crown, Geirangerfjord, surrounded by majestic mountain peaks, steep cliffs and cascading waterfalls. In autumn, we explore the idyllic Hjørundfjord - only Hurtigruten sails into this gem of a fjord.







We set our course for the spectacular UNESCO-listed Geirangerfjord, passing sheer 800-metre high cliffs and impressive waterfalls en route. Our excursion starts by driving up Ørneveien (the Eagle Road). From the top, there is a magnificent view over the fjord itself. We then continue to serene Eidsdal, from where you can enjoy a picturesque ferry ride to Linge. Back on dry land, the excursion continues into wild, high-alpine areas. One of the many highlights of this trip is the drive down the winding Trollstigen Pass, renown for its 11 hairpin bends. This day of great experiences concludes with dinner in Molde, before continuing on your Hurtigruten expedition.



Hike in the Hjørundfjord 2H

Join a pleasant hike and visit an old shieling, where you can learn about farming and taste local delicacies. Once we reach the shieling, our hosts tell us about life on the farm in the past. You then have time to explore the site on your own, and sample locally produced delicacies.




Atlanterhavsparken is one of Northern Europe's largest saltwater aquariums. Enjoy close encounters with some of the rich marine life of Norway. The visit includes a spectacular diving show, where the fish can be seen being hand-fed by the divers, and a visit to the open-air pool to see the resident penguins.



World *class* Art Nouveau architecture **2C/E**

After it was destroyed by fire in 1904, Ålesund was rebuilt in the fashionable Art Nouveau style of the era. The beautiful buildings are well preserved. Climb the 418 steps to the top of Mount Aksla right in the centre of the town. On the way up, you'll see the statue of the Viking King Gange Rolv. Several sources say Gange Rolv might be the mysterious Viking who became the Duke of Normandy known as Rollo, an ancestor of William the Conqueror.



WHAT TO SEE

In autumn, we explore Hjørundfjord, situated amidst the unspoiled nature of the majestic Sunnmøre Alps and populated with tiny hamlets and mountain farms. The highly popular Hjørundfjord region is regarded as a national treasure, but the fjord itself is something of a secret, left out of all other tourist routes. We sail past steep rock walls, green meadows and isolated mountain farms – all offering a window to the past. Off the beaten track, you discover a fjord treasured by royalty. No wonder this is known to be one of the most beautiful fjords in the world!



A gothic cathedral


Nidaros Cathedral is Norway's most famous church, and the only one built in the Gothic style. Built over the burial place of St. Olav, the patron saint of Norway, the construction of this enormous building started as far back as the 1100s.





— Trondheim, formerly called Nidaros, was founded in 997 A.D. and was Norway's capital from 1030 to 1217.

The city is home to Norway's national shrine, Nidaros Cathedral, which has been a popular pilgrimage destination for nearly 1,000 years. Today, it is a city of students, technology, culture, cycling and food. Trondheim's architecture and surroundings create a beautiful, almost mystical atmosphere for any outing, whether you prefer a guided tour of Nidaros Cathedral, kayaking on the River Nid and into the city's smaller channels, or a casual walk or bicycle ride among the beautifully restored wooden buildings in the Bakklandet district.



The lighthouse

Kjeungskjær Lighthouse is located on a tiny island – and we pass it on our way north. This red brick, octagonal lighthouse is 20.6 metres tall. Built in 1880, it was automated in 1987. The light is lit from July 21 until May 16. The Midnight Sun makes the light unnecessary during the interim period.



Down to the river s

The river that flows quietly through the centre of Trondheim is a great destination in itself. Kayaking on the river lets you see the city from a completely different angle. Remember to take small detours into the many canals off the river's main channel.

A taste of nature

The Norwegian coast is rich with delicacies, inspiring us to develop the ship's cuisine based solely on fresh local produce. During your journey, you can enjoy a variety of tastings out on deck.



The Bakklandet district

Here you'll find beautiful wooden buildings, now fully restored to their original charm. These often single-storey houses were inhabited by artisan craftsmen, local traders and labourers, which is why they tend to be smaller and simpler than those in the centre of Trondheim.

Make sure you catch the view from the Gamle Bybrua bridge that dates back to 1861, and wander around the restored wooden buildings in the Bakklandet district.

— Today we cross the Arctic Circle. This invisible border, at 66 degrees 33 minutes north, marks the southernmost point of the Midnight Sun, which shines 24 hours a day in summer.

The chances of catching the Northern Lights in winter are also higher above this line. This is where the Arctic begins. Norway's second largest glacier, Svartisen, is located near the old trading village and port of call Ørnes. Our journey continues along the beautiful Helgeland coastline, considered by many to be just as spectacular as Lofoten. In the afternoon, we sail from Bodø across Vestfjord, and the 1,000 metre-high mountain Lofotveggen appears on the horizon. Then we reach Lofoten. For part of the year, we also sail into the amazingly narrow Trollfjorden.

Rorbu

You find 'rorbuer' all along the coast, at the water's edge and often built atop sturdy timber piles. These fishermens' cabins are reminders of a time in the past, when exhausted, cold fishermen tied their boats up at the wharf, offloaded their fishing gear and found a place to sleep for the night. Many of these cabins now serve as cafés and tiny restaurants or are rented out as accommodation.







Rib to Saltstraumen 4D

Travel by rigid inflatable boat (RIB) to Saltstraumen, the world's strongest tidal current. Four times a day (ebb and flow), an incredible 400 million m³ of water forces its way in and out of the narrow, three-kilometre-long channel at a speed of about 29 knots. It also creates powerful whirlpools. The current is strongest during new and full moons.



The Chieftain's Castle 4E/F

In Stamsund, you are invited into the Viking Museum Lofotr and its longhouse. This is a full-scale architectural reconstruction of the seat of a chief from the Viking Age. The interior merges ultramodern with how it was originally.





Big birds

The white-tailed eagle is a very large bird, and measures up to 90 cm in length and up to 2.5 m in wingspan. The wingspan is on average the largest of any eagle. Close encounters between man and eagle are not uncommon as we sail through the birds' natural habitat. If you see one during your voyage (or if you join the sea eagle safari in Lofoten on day 9), you'll realise just how big a bird this is.





WHAT TO SEE

The charms of the Lofoten Islands are revealed in their small, picturesque fishing villages with a bohemian atmosphere. Tucked in between majestic granite cliffs and white sandy beaches, Lofoten is an experience that is out of the ordinary.

Join our 'silent whale exploring' excursion – a fascinating marine safari on a boat with minimal noise pollution, as we get close to these magnificent giants without disturbing them. You can also have fun while dog sledging, hiking and learning about Norway's fascinating polar history. Or join us for a kayaking excursion where you can admire this beautiful Arctic city from a waterborne point of view.

Giants of the sea

The whale has a mystical place in literature, has been hunted to the brink of extinction, and has been the object of genuine fascination by seafarers and adventurers all over the world. With Hurtigruten, you may encounter whales while sitting on deck in the fjords of Northern Norway, on a silent whale exploring excursion or even from a kayak – an outing as close to the water you can possibly get without actually jumping in.



A primal force 5B

In winter and spring, you can go dog sledging. This is an experience of a lifetime as you travel silently across the snow-covered landscape, pulled forward by the pure primal force of a pack of canine friends.



Polar Nights

The polar night occurs when the sun does not rise above the horizon. This only occurs above the polar circle in Norway, and this far north there are almost two months of polar nights during winter. Even though the sun remains below the horizon, Northern Norway is not blacked out completely there is a gloriously eerie blue shade to the skies, and on clear days, we can see beautiful sunset colours in the south while the sky to the north is a deep midnight blue.



Explorer boat activities

In Tromsø, you can join the expedition team and explore the coast from an even closer range. Our on-board experts share their first-hand knowledge about wildlife, natural phenomena, history and landscapes – and pursue adventurous detours when opportunities arise along the route.



Kayaking in Tromsø 56

Experiencing the region at sea level provides an entirely different perspective. Kayaking is not only exciting and intense, it's as close to marine wildlife as you can get, including otters, puffins, sea eagles and bottlenose dolphins.





WHAT TO SEE

The Ølhallen pub in Tromsø opened in 1928 in the cellar of Macks Bryggeri, the northernmost brewery in the world. Ølhallen is situated at the southern end of Tromsø's main street, Storgata, and is easy to find. You can go on a guided tour of the brewery or just enjoy a beer with the regulars. Expect a lot of gossip and laughter.



And while here, you should visit the North Cape Hall where you can watch a wonderful movie about North Cape, send postcards to friends and family back home or just relax over a cup of coffee.



Reindeer

Essential to Sámi culture and life, reindeer provide everything from clothes to food and are kept in herds that are moved long distances across vast areas of land to the rhythm of changing seasons. The highest concentration of reindeer held as livestock is found on the Finnmark plateau, where for centuries Sámi have been moving their herds back and forth from the inland to the coast.

Birdwatching safari

Not far from North Cape is Gjesværstappan, one of the world's most impressive nature reserves. Join our birdwatching safari and experience the hustle and bustle during nesting season. You see a number of different bird species, and if you are lucky, you may also see the mighty sea eagle hovering overhead.

Sámi culture 60

Get a taste of Sámi culture. You are invited into the 'lavvo', where a roaring fire, steaming hot broth, and 'joiking' (Sámi chanting) create a magical aura while you hear about Sámi culture and way of life.

Snowmobile trip in the Arctic 60

In winter, join us on an unforgettable snowmobile trip to one of Europe's most exciting natural areas. Along the way, the guide tells you about the Sámi people, the geographic and climatic conditions and how the local population works with nature in both the summer and winter months. If you are lucky, you might also see the Northern Lights dance across the polar night sky.



Cultural connections

You'll find many Russian influences in Kirkenes; even road signs are written in both Norwegian and Russian.



— Kirkenes is known as the capital of the Barents Region and is the gateway to the east.

The town is also Hurtigruten's turning point of our 12-day voyage. You notice that the landscape and sea along the coast of Finnmark become increasingly more dramatic the closer we come to Kirkenes, which is located just a few miles from the Russian border.


Catch and eat the king crab. With an experienced fisherman, you travel by RIB-boat and pull up the crabs yourself, before you prepare a delicious meal in an old traditional boathouse.





A hotel made of *snow*

If you are here in winter, we recommend a visit to the Kirkenes Snowhotel. Snow is actually a very good insulator, so when it drops to minus thirty degrees Celsius outside, the interior of the Snowhotel remains at a stable minus four degrees. Each room is decorated with beautiful sculptures of ice and snow and equipped with everything needed for a comfortable night. Your mattress is well insulated, and your Arctic sleeping bag will keep you warm and cosy.



Midnight Sun

A delightful natural phenomenon occurs in summer. The Midnight Sun is when the sun is above the horizon all day and all night. For some areas in Northern Norway, we are talking about more than 1,800 hours in a row where the sun just does not set.

— We now bid the region of Finnmark farewell, as we sail southbound past Fruholmen and Europe's northernmost lighthouse.

On Hjelmsøy, you have a great view of Europe's largest colony of guillemots and razorbills. From Honningsvåg, you can choose to enjoy breakfast at North Cape, and in Hammerfest, you can join a mountain trek or guided tour of the town. In spring, we also enjoy views of the beautiful Lyngen Alps, as we take a detour into the Lyngenfjord.

Bird cliffs

These waters contain a rich source of food for puffins, auks, common guillemots, kittiwakes, northern gannets, storm petrels, northern fulmars and cormorants.






Magic Polar Night 85

We dock at Mehamn in the middle of the night, but do not close your eyes just yet. Keep them wide open, dress warmly and get out into the polar night. We offer an unforgettable snowmobile trip through one of Europe's most extreme and fascinating natural areas.

The Arctic Cathedral

We dock in Tromsø in time to enjoy an unmissable midnight concert at the architecturally unique Arctic Cathedral. Alternatively, you can visit some of the town's many pubs and restaurants. Few cities in Norway can boast of a better nightlife. Be sure to try the local brew 'Mack', the city's pride and joy.










Excursions in Lofoten

This is the perfect place for adventure and exploration. In Svolvær, you can choose between several seasonal excursions. Enjoy a trip out to the Lofoten Islands where you can visit small fishing villages, or join a guided walk around the idyllic area of Svinøya. Hop aboard a local fishing boat and try your luck against the big cod. If you want an adrenaline rush, join a RIB excursion around the fantastic Lofoten archipelago. In this high-speed adventure, you get to see a lot of Lofoten, including a magnificent lagoon with a stunning, secluded beach. Or maybe you would rather choose a quiet horse ride through Lofoten's breathtaking scenery.



Still carrying freight and passengers

Risøyhamn is a small village on the island of Andøya. We stop here to drop off passengers – and to deliver food and post to the locals, numbering approximately 200 inhabitants. Delivering food, money and medicines has been an important task for Hurtigruten for 125 years, and an invaluable service to the communities living along Norway's coast.



Raftsundet

Raftsundet is a 20-kilometre-long strait between Lofoten and Vesterålen, flanked by 1,000-metrehigh mountains. As we sail through the strait, you see picturesque villages still inhabited as well as those abandoned long ago, a beautiful cemetery island and small white beaches. We then come to the mouth of Trollfjord, the two-kilometre-long, 100-metre-wide fjord. Weather permitting, we venture in... of all the experiences with Hurtigruten, don't forget your camera!

— As you reluctantly tear yourself away from Lofoten, we sail onwards towards the Helgeland coast, with its equally magnificent sights.

In the morning, we cross the Arctic Circle and head for the Helgeland coast with its abundance of islands, islets, reefs and steep mountain walls. This is the home of the unique rock formation Hestmannen, the peculiar mountain Torghatten with its distinctive hole, and the spectacular Seven Sisters mountain range. We make a short stop in Nesna, an idyllic old trading post, before moving on to Sandnessjøen, Brønnøysund and Rørvik.

A *strange* mountain in the sea

Torghatten (258 metres above sea level) is famous for the distinctive hole right through the middle of the mountainside. The hole is 160 metres long, 35 metres high and 20 metres wide and was created during the ice age. The softer rock gradually eroded, while harder rock around the hole remained. The walk up to the hole takes about 20 minutes along a natural trail.









Domesticating birds TOB

Between Sandnessjøen and Brønnøysund, just south of the Arctic Circle, lays the Vega Archipelago. This unique cultural landscape, consisting of dozens of islands, was inscribed on UNESCO's World Heritage List in 2004. The UNESCO award was in recognition of the unique interaction between the eider duck and the island population during the nesting season. Learn how fishermen and farmers have maintained sustainable living for 1,500 years, and how the women have contributed to eiderdown harvesting.





Cod liver oil tasting

The day starts early and crossing the Arctic Circle at 66° 33' N is an important 'rite of passage' as we now leave the Arctic north and Midnight Sun behind. We celebrate this with a ceremony out on deck. Close your eyes, open your mouth and take a spoonful of cod liver oil. Nothing is healthier or more beneficial than this. If you're good and swallow every drop, you get to keep the spoon.





The home of the salmon 100

Norway is one of the world's largest exporters of fish and seafood. In Brønnøysund, one of the most important salmon farming locations, we offer an excursion to the Norwegian Aquaculture Centre. Here you can learn about modern fish farming, see how the fish live and what they eat.

The Seven Sisters

Seven beautiful mountaintops along the Helgeland coast are the source of a local legend. The story goes that there were seven troll sisters, the daughters of king Suliskongen who kept them under strict control. One night when he fell into a deep sleep, the seven maidens managed to sneak out. Vågekallen, who was eager for a wife, was lying in wait. He chased the sisters, who fled southwards down the coast. Several other trolls joined the chase to either capture or rescue them. When night turned to morning, the troll sisters and their pursuers were petrified as the sun turns all trolls to stone. They all became the rocks and mountains that today make the Helgeland coastline one of the most beautiful places in the world.

— Today gives you another opportunity to explore the city of Trondheim. Continuing south, the ship heads slowly out of the Trondheimsfjord, passing the islands of Munkholmen, Hitra and thousands of islets and skerries.

Next stop is Kristiansund. The city's location has provided the town with a wealth of opportunities in the fishing, ship building and oil industries. It is now regarded as Norway's 'cured cod capital' because of its long-time export of salted dry fish. As we cross the open sea to Molde, known as the 'city of roses', you can take in the view of the steep, grey, pointed peaks of the Romsdal Alps from deck.



'Cliff-fish'

As we sail along the coast, you'll realise the importance of fish to Norwegian coastal communities. In Norwegian, dried cod is called 'klippfisk', literally 'cliff-fish'. The name comes from the traditional practice of drying the cod outdoors, often on cliffs and other bare rock faces. You'll see many of these fish racks during your voyage.





A walk through 1,000 years 11A

Enjoy a guided tour through the historic capital of Norway. Visit spectacular Nidaros Cathedral. The building of Norway's national sanctuary began in 1070. Nidaros Cathedral displays beautiful stained glass from the 19th and the 20th centuries, and the statues and ornaments of the west front is a great attraction in itself. You will also see Trondheim's streets, boroughs and highlights, including a short stop at Utsikten (The View) to admire the city from a high elevation.



Explorer boat activities

Also in Trondheim, you can join the expedition team to explore the coast from an even closer range. Our onboard experts share their first-hand knowledge about wildlife, natural phenomena, history and landscapes – and pursue adventurous detours when opportunities arise along the route.

A magnificent mine III

Join an unforgettable boat trip on an illuminated crystal clear lake. We then visit the marble mine Bergtatt before enjoying a meal in amazing surroundings. The excursion also includes a short sightseeing tour in Molde.







— FROM REVOLUTIONARY COASTAL connection to global travel – and still calling at 34 ports along the Norwegian coast every day all year round. In 1893, Captain Richard With's steamer, DS Vesteraalen, started a regular scheduled service along the coast of Norway, and Hurtigruten was born. The service had several weekly departures, first from Trondheim to Hammerfest and later from Bergen to Kirkenes – in only seven days! No wonder this important coastal connection was called 'Hurtigruten' (The Fast Route). Today, 125 years later, our 12 ships call at

34 ports along the Norwegian coast daily all year round. We are proud to share these unique destinations with our guests. We still have the same goal as in 1893, to be a reliable mode of transportation for both freight and passengers. In 2016, we had 330,000 local passengers, travelling shorter stretches between ports. In addition, we transported cargo, equivalent to more than 10,000 large lorries, combining global travel, local transportation and cargo into one unique service.



FARWELL TO THE CLASS SYSTEM ON BOARD

Since 1949, seven new ships have been added to the fleet. Hurtigruten transports 500,000 passengers a year. The class system on board is no longer used.

Our present energy-saving measures have helped reduce annual emissions to 540 tonnes NOx and 18,000 tonnes CO2. Our environmental policy states that no heavy fuel is permitted onboard. Our vessels operate on the lighter fuel types SDM/MGO only. We want to be a global front-runner and set new precedents in green shipping.



MS SPITSBERGEN

MS Spitsbergen is named after Norway's Arctic pearl - the largest island in the Svalbard Archipelago that sits between Norway and the North Pole. Hurtigruten has a long history of travelling to this remote destination, starting back in 1896 with its 'Sports Route'. MS Spitsbergen sails along the Norwegian coast from September to May, and becomes part our international Explorer expedition voyages the rest of the year. After complete reconstruction, MS Spitsbergen re-joined the Hurtigruten fleet in 2016. The new ship features high technical and hospitality standards with comfortable, modern public areas and cabins. Her fresh, Scandinavian design reflects a colour palette derived from the sea. She is sleek and environmentally friendly and continuously undergoes improvements to reduce emissions and fuel consumption. The ship's optimal size and manoeuvrability make her highly suitable for exploring polar waters. Correspondence

If you make your booking through a travel agent, all communication between you and Hurtigruten must be via that agent. If you book your holiday direct with us, all correspondence will be sent to the Lead Passenger. Please quote your booking reference number in all communications. When you or your agent first contact us, we will usually confirm your holiday at the earliest opportunity and advise current flight times and prices, including any applicable supplements or extras, etc. For high season dates, when demand is greater, or if you book within eight weeks of departure, we may have to request your cabin, flight or hotel space and it may take slightly longer to confirm your holiday. An invoice will be sent to confirm your arrangements. If you are travelling with friends but would each like to receive separate documents, please advise us at the time of booking. Travel documents are generally sent approximately 7-14 days prior to departure.

Special requests

If you have any special requests (e.g. dietary or medical), please inform us at the time of booking. We will do our best to meet such requests but cannot guarantee to do so and in no circumstances will any such request be accepted by us so as to form part of our contractual agreement.

Mobility

We are happy to welcome passengers who are not fully mobile and all ships (except MS Lofoten) have at least one cabin equipped for travellers using a wheelchair. Our sales consultants will also try to book appropriate hotel rooms. Passengers who use a wheelchair must bring their own, standard size, foldable chair. Guests who are able to navigate around the ship unaided in a wheelchair do not need to have a travel companion. Those who need assistance may need to be accompanied. Please discuss with your booking agent. When the ship stops at ports on the Norwegian coast, there is a ramp or gangway for embarkation/disembarkation. Excursions have not been adapted specifically for passengers with walking difficulties. Please contact us or the Tour Leader when you are on

board who will be able to advise which excursions are suitable. It is essential you advise us of special requirements at the time of booking to enable us to make the necessary arrangements for you.

Changes to the itinerary and excursions

All routes and excursions are provisional and subject to change – weather, sea and ice conditions may affect the itinerary. Excursions may also be subject to minimum/maximum numbers. As Christmas approaches, itineraries may change in order for ships to host dinners and celebrations for local communities. Please take care that you are back in time on board, especially when your ship arrives with a delay but departs on time to keep the schedule. The departure time is displayed at the gangway. Please note that ships cannot wait for late passengers. If you miss your ship, you will need to arrange by yourself and at your own expense the trip to the next harbour.

Minimum numbers

Some holidays are subject to a minimum number of participants to enable them to take place. Should the minimum not be reached we will advise you at least 60 days prior to your departure, when we reserve the right to cancel the holiday. We reserve the right to cancel the holiday and to refund all monies paid to us. Alternatively, you may choose another holiday with us, but if the alternative arrangement is at an additional cost, the difference will be payable by you.

BEFORE YOU GO

Passports and ID cards

All guests have to present a valid passport or government approved ID card when they check-in.

Vaccinations

At the time of printing this brochure, there are no compulsory vaccinations or health require-

ments for travelling to Norway. It is however the responsibility of all passengers to ensure they comply with any health requirements at the time of travel. We suggest you consult your doctor or relevant health authorities about any precautions you should take with regard to Deep Vein Thrombosis (DVT).

Currency in Norway

We suggest that you take a small amount of local currency (Norwegian Kroner-NOK) in cash. Major credit cards are widely accepted except possibly at smaller businesses. You may be asked to provide identification when you pay by credit card or exchange money. Please also see 'Payment options' on page 87.

GENERAL

Brochure accuracy

The information and descriptions contained in this brochure have been checked by our staff and/or local agents to ensure they are correct. However, changes may occur after the date of publication and there may be occasions when Hurtigruten or local suppliers may withdraw some facilities. Should we become aware of any significant change which may be considered to have an effect on the enjoyment of your holiday, we will do our utmost to advise you. Public holidays and religious festivals may also affect the availability of resort and hotel facilities. Tourist offices can provide details of such events.

Wildlife & natural phenomena

Hurtigruten brochures include pictures and descriptions of wildlife, which may be seen from the ships and during excursions. Spending time on outside decks increase your chance of spotting wildlife and natural phenomena but there is no guarantee of sightings.

Environmental commitment

Hurtigruten's environmental efforts are tied to our strategic six-point policy;

1. That environmentally-oriented measures



- are identified and implemented in day-to-day operations.
- 2. That focus is directed specifically at the marine environment.
- 3. That we specify requirements for subcontractors and contractual partners.
- That our communications concerning our own environmental performance are open and complete.
- 5. That we ensure continuous monitoring and improvement of our environmental work.
- 6. That we do not leave any permanent traces behind us in vulnerable areas.

As a traveller with Hurtigruten, your contribution to environmental care is welcome. We have garbage sorting aboard all ships, and we encourage you to turn off lights when leaving the cabin and pull out the plug from electrical transformers not in use. When ashore, bring your litter back to the vessel or dispose at designated places. We are often near wildlife on our voyages. Please heed the advice of our tour leader/expedition leader and excursion guides and strive towards acting in a way that does not alter the wildlife's natural behaviour.

Hotel accommodation

The standard of the hotels we use is equivalent to 3 or 4-star. There is no official hotel rating system in Norway. All rooms have private facilities (except for the Snowhotel in Kirkenes). Single rooms may be smaller and less conveniently situated and may be double rooms for sole occupancy or purpose-built single rooms. Hotels may charge for some facilities e.g. saunas.

ON BOARD INFORMATION

Activities on board

As a part of Hurtigruten's seasonal product concepts, we offer some interesting on-board activities, demonstrations and presentations during the voyages. The activities which take place both inside the vessels and out on deck, have relevance to the season we are sailing in. Our aim is to get closer to unique environments and share the experience with fellow passengers. It is up to the guest to join and the activities will be announced in our daily programmes or announced on board.

Cabins

For guests travelling on a Select or a Platinum fare, you will be able to choose a cabin grade and cabin number at no extra charge (subject to availability). For guests on a Basic fare, your cabin grade and number will be assigned to you at check-in on board. Please note that cabins on decks with passenger access to outside areas may sometimes have an obstructed view due to other passengers walking past. Please ask our reservations team for advice on the best cabin location for you.

Cafeteria

Hot and cold drinks and snacks may be bought in the cafeteria. Opening hours are advised on board.

Dietary requests

Special diets, e.g. vegetarian can be catered for if requested in good time. Passengers on strict diets, e.g. vegans, may find that there is a limited choice. We now offer a 3-course vegan menu option for the evening meal on our 12-day voyages.

Electric current

220v AC. – 2 pin Continental-type for which an adapter is required. Guests are advised to bring their own adapters with them on the voyage.

Embarkation/disembarkation

In Bergen, Hurtigruten ships sail from the Hurtigruten Terminal, Nøstegaten 30, N-5010 Bergen. Taxi drivers will understand if you ask to be taken to the Hurtigruten Terminal and it is sign-posted as such locally. Luggage lockers are

available in the terminal at a charge. The terminal is staffed and open for luggage check-in from 13:00 hrs. Passenger check-in begins at 15:00 hrs and embarkation takes place from 16:00 hrs. Cabins are available from 18:00 hrs.

There are no restaurant facilities in the terminal and passengers are free to explore Bergen until embarkation time. A buffet dinner is served in the evening of departure from Bergen, usually between 18:00-21:00 with free seating this evening only. Guests with a Select or Platinum fare can request their preferred dining time when booking, although this is still subject to availability. Guests on a Basic fare will be assigned their dining time at check-in on board. When disembarking in Bergen, luggage will be delivered to the baggage belt in the terminal. On the last day of your voyage, you will be asked to vacate your cabin a few hours before disembarkation. Information regarding luggage handling and disembarkation at other ports is available on board.

Gratuity policy

It is not common practice to tip on Hurtigruten ships on the coastal voyage, but if you feel that crew members should be rewarded for providing exceptional service, tip boxes are placed in the restaurant together with envelopes.

Information

There will be an information and safety meeting before departure from Bergen and Kirkenes. Each ship has a Tour Leader on board who sells and advises on excursions, issues a daily programme and news bulletin, and makes announcements regarding places of interest, disembarkation, etc. Occasionally this service may be carried out by the reception. All Tour Leaders speak Norwegian, English and German.

Internet

We have wireless internet available on board for a small charge, unless already included in your Select or Platinum fare. Please ask for more information at the on-board reception.

Languages

Norwegian and English are the official on-board languages. The personnel at the reception and some of the service crew often also speak German. The Tour Leader speaks Norwegian, English and German. Expedition leaders speak Norwegian and English.

Laundry

Laundry rooms with washing machines, dryers and irons are available on all ships. Tokens can be purchased at reception.

Meals

Breakfast is usually served from 07:30 hrs (open seating), lunch from 12:00 (open seating), and dinner from 18:00. It is possible to book individual seating times for dinner, subject to availability and fare. During the high season, there will be limited availability for some dining slots unless pre-booked. Lunch may also be served in two seatings due to capacity issues. The 12-day voyage begins with a buffet dinner on departure from Bergen, and ends with brunch on arrival back in Bergen.

Norway's culinary traditions have much in common with the scenery of the coastline. It is always fresh, distinctive and full of variety. We have always strived to give our guests a truly unique and authentic experience, and local produce and old food traditions are incorporated into every element of the culinary experience on board as well. We pride ourselves on using many local suppliers and ingredients from up and down Norway's coast, with our 'Norway's Coastal Kitchen' on board our ships. Breakfast consists of a good selection of cold meats, cheeses, eggs, cereals and fruit, with freshly baked bread, pastries and often 'sveler' and 'waffles' freshly cooked in the restaurant. The all-inclusive package includes a mixture of buffets and set menus for lunches and dinners,





while for those guests not on a Platinum fare but who wish to enjoy an enhanced dining experience, we offer Norway's Coastal Kitchen's à la carte menu available for a small additional charge.

All vessels are fully licensed, and the prices on board are similar to those on the Norwegian mainland.

Medical assistance

There is no doctor or pharmacy on board. However, officers are trained in first aid and can provide emergency medical assistance. The ships are also close to land should urgent medical assistance be required.

Payment options

Norwegian currency is used on board. Most major currencies may be exchanged. Visa, American Express, MasterCard and Diners Card are all accepted. A cruise card can be obtained and used for payment for extras and settled at the end of your voyage. This may be subject to change.

Porterage

Luggage handling is not included in the cost of your holiday. Unless you are embarking or disembarking the ship at the Hurtigruten Terminal in Bergen, you will need to carry your own luggage on and off the ship at all other ports.

Safety

It is a safety requirement that all Hurtigruten passengers attend a compulsory safety briefing in Bergen before the ship leaves port. After check in and before embarkation, please go to the first floor of the terminal building where the safety briefing will be given at intervals by Hurtigruten staff. This will last between 10 - 15 minutes with the first taking place at 15:45 (embarkation is from 16:00, also from the first floor). The talk will include a demonstration of how to put on a life jacket and the instructions to be followed in the unlikely event of an evacuation or other emergency during the voyage. The briefing is compulsory for all passengers including those who have travelled with Hurtigruten on previous occasions. There will be an opportunity to ask questions if you have

any concerns. When you have completed the safety briefing, please embark straight away. The last briefing will take place at 19:30. Guests who arrive after this time will be required to attend a safety meeting on board at 20:00 before the ship leaves Bergen. Please familiarise yourself with the emergency procedures as shown in the cabins (there is a diagram on the cabin door and in public areas), and ask at reception if in doubt. In many ports, there may be a good deal of activity on the quay with cars joining/leaving the ships and/or goods being loaded or unloaded. Please be alert to such traffic when embarking and disembarking. Take care during winter months when it is icy underfoot, particularly on the outside decks and when disembarking the ship or alighting from coaches. Ice spikes and other winter clothing can be purchased in the ships store. Do not carry large amounts of cash and keep valuable items, including mobile telephones and cameras, out of sight.

Ships with expedition teams

From April 2018, nine out of 11 ships (except on MS Vesterålen and MS Lofoten) along the Norwegian coast have an Expedition Leader, an expedition team and special activities on board like lectures and presentations, on-deck guiding, gatherings and environmental actions. These ships function as a 'base camp' – the place where you sleep, eat and share experiences – and they are the starting point for all our onshore activities.

Shops

Our on-board shops carry a selected range of high quality knitwear, clothing, souvenirs and gift items. In addition, there is also a small selection of toiletries available for purchase. On MS Lofoten, this service is handled by the cafeteria.

Shore excursions

Pre-booking excursions (where possible) is recommended as only the remaining places will be sold on board. Excursions booked on board will be payable in Norwegian Kroner and the price may vary as a result of exchange rate fluctuations. Pre-booking of shore excursions is possible until 4 weeks prior to departure. If you choose to pay by credit-card, pre-bookings

can be made until 2 weeks prior to departure. Excursions and their contents are subject to maximum/minimum numbers, sailing times and weather/local conditions.

Smoking

Smoking is only permitted in designated areas on the outside decks. Smoking is strictly forbidden when the ships are in port and fuelling and the staff will advise when such times are.

Stabilisers

With the exception of MS Lofoten, all of our vessels are equipped with stabilisers.

Telephone/mobile phones

Private mobile telephones may be used on board although reception may vary. Check with your provider for costs when using your phone abroad.

What to wear

On board, dress is informal. Although some passengers choose to change for dinner, the dress code is casual rather than formal. The weather in Norway can vary during the course of each voyage or even during the day. To cater for these variations, we recommend the layered-dress approach that enables you to adapt to changes in temperature, wind and precipitation conditions easily. For all voyages, we advise you to take breathable rain and windproof clothing. A warm hat, gloves, scarf and thermal clothing can be useful, together with thermal underwear, during the winter months. On land where it may be icy, sturdy shoes are important for shore excursions and a walking stick/trekking pole may be useful.

Working ships

Our ships function as working ships calling at ports around the clock. You may experience some noise and vibration in some cabins during docking and loading of goods. This varies depending on the location of your cabin and the type of ship. Also, noise affects people differently and what may be a problem for one person may not be a problem for another.




