

PAPEETE, THE ISLAND OF LOVE



The island may no longer be the idyll of Gauguin, but on your overnight here you'll find it's as close to paradise as reality gets.

PAPEETE — SYDNEY

Lose yourself in the exotic world of the South Pacific. Punctuated by tiny islands of awe, this chapter sees you luxuriate in the endless ocean. Thus, as the New World hoves into view, spoil yourself with the spectacular scenery and thoughts of the lush antipodean adventures that lie ahead.



COOK ISLANDS, PARADISE INCARNATE

In a region renowned for its island paradises, the Cook Islands are an under-the-radar jewel. Named after Captain James Cook, who first visited the islands in 1773, the Cook Islands have a fascinating history. The first settlers – Maoris sailing Tupua'l (now French Polynesia) are said to have arrived in around 800 AD, guided by the stars in their magnificent Vakas. No traffic lights, no Mcdonald's and no building taller than a coconut tree, this pristine setting is a perfect balance of beauty and tradition.



AUCKLAND, CITY OF SAILS

In a nation where stunning scenery is taken for granted, New Zealand's largest city sparkles like a freshly polished jewel. Soaring volcanoes encircle Auckland while an endless succession of bays stretches along its shores. This waterborne wonderland is lapped by two seas with over a 100 beaches within an hour's drive. Take a jet boat ride around the magnificent harbour and discover how beautiful the "City of Sails" really is.

AUSTRALIA, THE LEGENDARY LAND OF DOWN UNDER

The golden coasts of Eastern Australia are on any traveller's list of must-sees. It is filled with everything the savvy voyager could want: iconic sites — Sydney Opera House, Whitehaven Inlet or the Great Barrier Reef, arty laid-back ambience in Cairns and sunny, sophisticated elegance in Brisbane. The world's largest island is also the world's smallest continent, so expect a captivating country where superlatives and expectations fuse together into a seamless melting-pot of the good life.



KOMODO, HOME OF THE DRAGON


The volcanic island of Komodo, famed for its National Park and its dragons hosts a tangible legacy left behind from the Jurassic Era. Considered as only a myth until pearl fishermen discovered the giant lizards in the early-1900s, the Komodo Dragon is one of the world's most intelligent animals, thanks to its uncanny sense of smell and great agility. However, the Dragon is regrettably, another species on the endangered list. Established in 1980 to conserve the beast's legacy, the Komodo National Park was declared a UNESCO World Heritage site in 1986.



Temples of Beauty

BENOA — TOKYO

If beauty were a goddess, this is where she would be worshipped. The fourth chapter of your journey winds through the stone temples and pervading jade landscapes of Bali, the natural poetry of Malaysia and the pristine shores and emerald ledges of the Philippines.



OSAKA, JAPAN'S METROPOLITAN MIRACLE

From Minami's neon-lighted Dotombori and historic Tenno-ji to the high-rise class and underground shopping labyrinths of Kita, Osaka is a city that pulses with its own unique rhythm. Though Osaka has no shortage of tourist sites, it is the city itself that is the greatest attraction. Home to some of Japan's best food, most unique fashions, and warmest locals, Osaka does not beg to be explored — it demands it.

TAIWAN, ONE OF ASIA'S BEST-KEPT SECRETS

Kaohsiung, Taiwan's industrial hub, has morphed into a green city of parks, waterside cafés, art galleries and museums. Explore Shoushan Mountain where monkeys roam free. Bike along beautiful Love River, and wander among the temples of Lotus Pond. Taipei is also a gem to explore from the fabled Chinese art collection at the National Museum to the world's tallest green building, Taipei 101. But be sure to spend a few hours wandering through its charming heritage lanes with their gourmet cafes and boutiques.



SANDAKAN, MALAYSIA'S MAJESTIC MARVEL

Borneo's forbidding interior made it less attractive to early traders and explorers than neighbouring areas, so what is now the state of Sabah remained unexploited by the British until the late 19th century, although traders long visited for exotic items such as bird's nests (for the celebrated Chinese soup). In 1963, Sabah joined Sarawak, Malaya, and Singapore (which later seceded) in forming the Federation of Malaysia. Known as the "Land Below the Wind" because it's south of the typhoon belt, Sandakan is a rare-window into the past.

MANILA, THE PEARL OF THE ORIENT

Founded in 1571 by Spanish conquistador Miguel López de Legazpi, the capital city of the Philippines, is one of the oldest cities in the country. Named "the Pearl of the Orient", the city is a delightful amalgam of tradition and modernity, skyscrapers piecing the sky nestled next to artisan markets and street-food sellers. Home to 16th century landmarks such as San Agustin Church as well as Fort Santiago, a storied citadel and military prison, the true traveller will not want to miss the edgy art scene — the creative soul of this city.

Time Travel

TOKYO — SINGAPORE

Is it possible to live several centuries in one day? As your story gathers momentum, we disappear into cultures as old as time. This fifth chapter of your tale plunges you into the history of ancient dynasties, Taoist philosophy and post-modern contradiction.



OVERNIGHT IN TOKYO, A TALE OF TWO CITIES

Lights, sushi, manga! Sprawling, frenetic, and endlessly fascinating, Japan's capital is a city of contrasts. Shrines and gardens are pockets of calm between famously crowded streets and soaring office buildings. Noodle houses share street space with Western-style chain restaurants and exquisite fine dining. Shopping yields lovely folk arts as well as the newest electronics. A new port for world cruisers, whether you seek the traditional or the cutting edge, Tokyo will provide it.

OVERNIGHT IN SHANGHAI, THE WORLD'S GREATEST CITY

Shanghai is a city of two faces. It is home to some of the world's tallest skyscrapers, miles of luxury goods shops, and scores of trendy bars and restaurants. But look just beyond the main streets and you'll find narrow alleyways packed with traditional lane houses, where laundry billows from bamboo poles, and local communities are alive and well. Shanghai has always been China's most westernised city. An overnight in this iconic port allows you time to delve deep into the mysteries of its past.

HONG KONG, THE CITY OF LIFE

The setting is exquisite — the mood electric. Chauffeured limousines careen down Victoria Peak. Skyscrapers overshadow craft shops and bustling bazaars. Narrow, winding streets give way to broad boulevards and mega-malls brim with all the wealth of the Orient. From jade markets and old-world noodle vendors to Hong Kong's celebrated Feng Shui skyline, what was once the jewel in the British crown has never shined brighter.



HO CHI MINH CITY, ASIA'S HAPPY CACAPHONY

There are six million people in this sprawling metropolis and they all seem to be out and about at the same time. In the downtown area, bicycles, motorcycles and new SUVs crowd the streets and the pavements are filled with people eating, drinking, shopping and selling. For Saigon (as the city centre is still called) is buzzing with energy and vitality, making sure that no visitor can ever be immune to its chaotic charms.

Ocean Treasures

SINGAPORE — MOMBASA

As time glides forward, delve deeper into the mysteries of the Indian Ocean. If chapter one was painted blue, this chapter is alive with the bright green of island vegetation. Vibrant flashes of psychedelic sea life are flanked by fairy-tale bays and crystal coasts, making this contemplative chapter a time for rejuvenation.



INDIAN OCEAN ISLANDS, HEAVEN ON EARTH

Like jade-coloured jewels in the Indian Ocean, the more than 115 Seychelles Islands are often regarded as the Garden of Eden. Just thinking of them makes your mind dizzy. The colour of the sea, the sound of the birds, the heat of the sun – nowhere else on earth is as evocative as here. And yet, splendour really does know no boundaries. No longer just for honeymooners, the Maldives host an endless sea of blue, alive with dazzling underwater life. And the best news is that you do not have to chose your favourite. Perfection.



SRI LANKA, TREASURES & MISTY LANDSCAPES


From tropical rainforests to amazing wildlife to beautiful tea plantations and colonial treasures, there are so many "must-see's" in the Teardrop of India you'll find it hard to choose. Visit the Temple of the Tooth in Kandy, one of the most sacred Buddhist shrines in the world. Stroll through the old Dutch fortress town of Galle, exquisitely preserved and a haven for artists and writers, or go on safari in the wildlife rich Yala Park where leopards still roam. Colombo, the jewels in Sri Lanka's crown, is a must.



The Wilderness

MOMBASA — CAPE TOWN

The pages continue to turn as we leave behind paradisiac beaches and accelerate towards the Motherland. This is where the baked red earth sings the song of children's chatter, where the big five roam, unperturbed, where spectacular flora and fauna dazzle you in startling contrast.



MADAGASCAR, LAND OF THE LEMURS

Approximately 80% of all plant and animal species found in Madagascar are endemic, which make the island a naturalist's dream come true. Although the island is rife with assorted flora and fauna, the best known animal is the lemur. This little primate, with its enormous eyes and adorable demeanour is unique to the island and displays a range of interesting behaviours from singing like a whale (the indri) to sashaying across the sand like a ballet dancer (the sifaka). Almost 60 species, sub-species and populations of the animal thrive on the island.



OVERNIGHT IN CAPE TOWN

Internationally heralded as one of the world's most beautiful cities, in one of the world's most beautiful countries, Cape Town and South Africa are on every traveller's bucket-list. From (finally) seeing the big five to the staggering natural beauty that abounds, not forgetting some of the most exquisite world-class cuisine on offer, you cannot escape the reasons why the city makes it time after time onto "word's best places". Relax during an overnight here and discover what all the fuss is about.



Slices of Colour

CAPE TOWN — LISBON

Stunning from sea to sky, the story continues as your journey takes you to the some of the world's most beautiful countries. Prepare for magical things to happen as you weave scent and colour into the heat-infused days and starry nights and you fall hopelessly under the charm of Africa's spell.



NAMIBIA, SAO TOME, SENEGAL, DISCOVERING THE WEST COAST OF AFRICA

Unchartered territory for so many, the west coast of Africa is quite incomparable to anywhere else in the world. From the perfection of Namibia, where history and passion are sculpted into every sand dune, to the magnificent lost world of Sao Tome with its fantastic beaches and lush jungle canopy, this is a coastline that is only just beginning to understand its own potential. The Tale of Tales continues along the pristine coast to vibrant Senegal, one of Africa's most welcoming and enigmatic countries.

CASABLANCA, OF ALL THE PORTS, IN ALL THE WORLD...

SEVILLE, SAIL INTO THE HEART OF SPAIN'S MOST CHARISMATIC CITY

Sail up the river Guadalquivir and arrive into the very centre of beautiful Seville. Moored just 10-minutes away from the city's exquisite Plaza de España and not much further from the world's largest gothic cathedral, disembark *Silver Whisper* and find yourself immediately surrounded by tapas bars, orange trees and the sounds of flamenco. Said to have been founded by Hercules, this is Spain's most joyous town



LISBON, EUROPE'S COOLEST CAPITAL

Spread over a string of seven hills north of the Rio Tejo estuary, Lisbon presents an intriguing variety of faces to those who negotiate its switchback streets. In the oldest neighbourhoods, stepped alleys whose street pattern dates back to Moorish times are lined with pastel-colour houses decked with laundry; here and there, miradouros (vantage points) afford spectacular river or city views. Discover the very best of the home of the delicious Pasteis de Nata.

Old World Alchemy

LISBON — LONDON

The culmination of the Tales of Tales ends with a wander back to the old world for a prosaic finale. Shrouded in clandestine streets, sprinkled with exceptional architecture and underlined with history, myth and tradition, your unique story reaches its thrilling climax in England's iconic capital.



BORDEAUX, TWO OVERNIGHTS IN FRANCE'S WINE CAPITAL

Enjoy two overnights in the capital of southwest France. The city remains synonymous with the wine trade: wine shippers have long maintained their headquarters along the banks of the Garonne. Bordeaux is lively and stylish and the recently revamped riverfront is said to exude an elegance reminiscent of St. Petersburg. The aura of 18th-century élan also permeates the historic downtown sector—"le vieux Bordeaux"—where fine shops invite gentle exploration.

SAINT MALO, STUNNING MONT-SAINT-MICHEL

Picture a place of magic and history, floating like a miracle on the horizon. Picture this and you have almost definitely pictured stunning Mont Saint Michel. Steeped deep into Christendom, pilgrims have flocked here for over a thousand years, searching for solitude; from as early as 966 communities have flocked to the famous island, creating the famous "pathway to paradise". Today, the abbey sits atop the island like a grande dame, inspiring all those who are lucky enough to lay eyes on her.

BILBAO, GEHRY'S GUGGENHEIM

Time in Bilbao could be recorded as BG or AG (Before Guggenheim or After Guggenheim). Never has a single monument of art and architecture so radically changed a city. Frank Gehry's stunning museum, Norman Foster's sleek subway system, the Santiago Calatrava glass footbridge and airport, the leafy César Pelli Abandoibarra Park, and the Philippe Starck Alhóndiga Bilbao cultural centre have contributed to an unprecedented cultural revolution in what was once the industry capital of the Basque Country.

LONDON GREENWICH, A FITTING FINALE

When one thinks of London, their thoughts are automatically on Big Ben, Pall Mall and Buckingham Palace. Nevertheless, the British Capital offers so much more than jaded tourist sites. London Greenwich, light years away from the tourist attractions, is home not only to the eponymous timeline, but also to a maritime museum, royal observatory and leafy parks. A fitting finale to a journey, or journal, of plenty.
