

In the Galician city of La Coruña, you'll find an array of attractions, including the ancient Tower of Hercules, an impressive seafront promenade, and Monte San Pedro; all of which present fabulous views. La Coruña is also the start point for tours to the incredible, UNESCO-listed Santiago de Compostela Cathedral.

Departing the Spanish mainland, *Balmoral* will divert to Leixões next. From here, don't miss the opportunity to take a rewarding trip to Portugal's second city of Oporto. With pretty pastelfronted houses, world-famous Port wine cellars and a UNESCO-listed historic centre to explore, you won't be disappointed. There's also a chance to take a relaxing boat cruise along the tranquil waters of the Douro River. Arriving into Funchal for an overnight stay, you'll benefit from ample time to explore the pretty 'garden island' of Madeira at your leisure. Beautifully fragrant gardens, particularly the Monte Palace Tropical Garden; unique levada exploration trails; and the towering Cabo Girão sea cliff, complete with a glass-bottomed viewing platform, all await your discovery. For a little extra indulgence, why not savour some traditional Madeira wine.

Back on the Portuguese mainland, attraction-packed Lisbon provides a fitting finale to your holiday. Fascinating museums, adorable historic districts and impressive monuments from the city's maritime history are just a few of the highlights on offer. Be sure to sample a delicious egg custard tart (Pastel de nata) during your stay, too – the secret formula for these sweet treats has remained unchanged since the 19th century.



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Your exploration of this sun-kissed region begins with two charming cities on the Spanish mainland. Malaga and Cartagena are gateways to historical and artistic treasures, from the Picasso Museum and Alhambra Palace to impressive Roman architecture. A full day on Ibiza affords time to experience the iconic sunset and discover there's much more to the island than its nightlife. Highlights include the Old Town of Dalt Vila; picturesque Formentera is within reach too. Menorcan delights follow shortly after. Perhaps you'll bask on your pick of inviting beaches, or go in search of incredible views from atop Monte Toro.

The French island of Corsica, a natural wonderland of breathtaking coastlines, forests, mountains and rivers, never fails to impress. *Balmoral* will dock at Ajaccio, birthplace of Napoléon and gateway to the dramatic Prunelli Gorges, where granite cliffs plunge into the Prunelli River, creating postcard-perfect scenes. Sophisticated Sardinia has much to recommend it too. You could stay in Olbia and capture the authentic Sardinian style, though the chance to tour to the luxury Costa Smeralda resort is sure to tempt.

Returning to Spanish shores, Mallorca ends your island-hopping adventure. Palma's sun-bathed streets and squares are yours to explore, with impressive sights such as the Gothic cathedral at every turn. Alternatively, you could board a vintage train to Soller, before exploring the traditional village of Valldemossa. En route back to the UK, the tapas bars and ancient centre of Cádiz, and the maritime architecture and Fado music of Lisbon, make for a rewarding finale.

Black Watch will call at three charming destinations en route to one of Europe's most captivating regions. Cádiz, Palma and Kerkira offer historical highlights and fine scenery galore. There's scenic cruising along the Strait of Messina and by the Stromboli volcano to inspire you too.

Sailing into Kotor via the beautiful Bay of Kotor will ensure an unforgettable welcome to the Adriatic. Here you could explore the town centre, or perhaps tour to Perast, renowned for its iconic islets. Up next is Hvar, where the golden beaches, pretty lagoons and terracotta architecture are sure to beckon you ashore. The Fortica Fortress and St Stephen's Square are among the attractions. An undoubted highlight will be a day in Venice. Nestled within the maze of canals, squares and ancient streets lie impressive sites such as the Doge's Palace and St Mark's Basilica. Take them in at your leisure, and be sure to enjoy a gondola ride too. Then it's on to Koper – the gateway to fairytale-esque Lake Bled. In Zadar meanwhile, you'll encounter impressive architecture including St Anastasia Cathedral.

On your overnight stay in Split, must-visit sites such as Diocletian's Palace await; while Trogir and Krka National Park are just a tour away. Dubrovnik is your final Croatian call. Explore the ancient walls, taking in the majestic churches, palaces and monasteries, and you'll soon understand why the city is known as the 'Pearl of the Adriatic'. The highlights don't stop there. You'll visit enchanting Valletta and the island of Menorca; discover delightful Malaga; and call into Leixões, gateway to pretty Oporto.

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Malaga and Menorca are rewarding stops en route to Sorrento, the start of your Italian adventure. On the gorgeous Amalfi Coast, overlooking the crystal-clear Bay of Naples, Sorrento offers views of legendary Mount Vesuvius and Naples. In Naples you could uncover the architectural wonders within the historic centre; or take a tour to the ash-dusted remains of Pompeii, the ancient city devastated by Vesuvius in 79CE.

Boudicca will return to the Amalfi Coast for Amalfi. Dazzling landscapes and quintessential villas will beckon you ashore to explore; Arab-Romanesque buildings and vivacious piazzas await. Perhaps you'll take a tour to stunning Positano too, before enjoying a scenic cruise by the island of Capri. Civitavecchia is your gateway to Rome. From the magnificent Colosseum to St Peter's Basilica in the Vatican, the highlights are seemingly endless. Next, a call at Livorno will afford you opportunities to tour to Pisa to see the iconic Leaning Tower; or to Florence for majestic domes and spires framed by rolling Tuscan hills.

To conclude you'll visit Cartagena, Lisbon and Vigo, all packed with cultural and architectural highlights.

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First up is Cádiz, believed to be Europe's oldest continuously inhabited settlement. The ancient centre is a maze of narrow streets, alleys and squares, perfect for immersive exploration. Cádiz is famed for its historic watchtowers and tapas, which – according to legend – originated in the city. For an authentic flavour of the region, head to Jerez, 'sherry capital of the world'.

During two days in Seville *Braemar* will be docked close to the Parque de Maria Luisa and iconic Plaza de España; the Moorish Alcázar Palace and Gothic Cathedral are within reach too. 



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The cruise begins with relaxed sailing en route to Reykjavik, gateway to some of Earth's most famous natural wonders. 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As you cruise the impressive Kiel Canal – only navigable by smaller ships – you'll benefit from *Braemar's* smaller size right away. 



Your discovery starts with views of the Eyjafjallajökull Volcano, which famously erupted in 2010; Elliðaey Island, home of the 'world's most isolated house'; and the unusual Elephant Rock, en route to the capital. Reykjavik is your gateway to the sites of the Golden Circle: the Geysir hot springs, the jaw-dropping Gullfoss Waterfall and Thingvellir National Park. Alternatively, take a plunge in the geothermal waters of the Blue Lagoon.






