

The Arctic AT A GLANCE

GREENLAND'S NORTHERN LIGHTS

Aurora displays occur when protons and electrons from the sun slam into the Earth's magnetic field, resulting in an awe-inspiring dance of multi-coloured lights across the night sky. The Northern Lights in Greenland tend to be green and white and can sometimes be viewed during the month of September.

ARCTIC EXPLORERS

Step back in time to the days of great Arctic explorers like Sir John Franklin and retrace his historic route through the Northwest Passage.

UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE SITE

Ilulissat Icefjord, a tidal fjord and UNESCO World Heritage site, is home to Sermeq Kujalleq, one of the fastest and most active glaciers in the world.



GREENLANDIC CULTURE

A visit to Iltoqqortoormiit, the most isolated town in Greenland, is a window into the daily life of a remote community where many inhabitants still hunt and fish to continue their traditional heritage.

ANCIENT HISTORY & CULTURE

Visiting local communities in the Canadian Arctic connects travelers to 4,000 years of history and culture. Pangnirtung, Pang for short, is an artistic community known for its beautiful hand-woven tapestries and lithographic prints.

MILLIONS OF BIRDS

The Látrabjarg Sea Cliffs, a 7 mile stretch of towering cliffs (up to 1,443 feet high) is famous for the millions of birds that nest along the majestic cliff-tops.

HISTORIC RUSSIAN ARCTIC

The rarely-visited Severnaya Zemlya, "Northern Land", was the last sizeable archipelago on Earth to be explored.



**ROCKY
PHENOMENON**

Discover a rare geological phenomenon at Champ Island in Franz Josef Land. Stone spheres found here likely formed when masses of minerals came in contact with organic material, creating a chemical reaction shaping the ball in layers, often as perfect spheres.



THE KING OF THE ARCTIC

Although a polar bear's fur appears white, it is actually a layer of transparent hair with special characteristics that create the illusion of white fur. A polar bear's skin is black. An optimal time to view polar bears in Spitsbergen is during the months of June and July.

ARCTIC ARCHIPELAGO

Novaya Zemlya, "New Land", is the third largest wilderness area in Europe. This remote Russian destination is abundant in wildlife and steeped in polar history.





Arctic Saga: Exploring Spitsbergen via the Faroes and Jan Mayen

Departing from Aberdeen, Scotland, the Arctic Saga voyage visits four remote Arctic islands and offers culture, polar history and iconic wildlife. Sail through the North Atlantic to Fair Isle, home to a famous bird observatory, followed by two days exploring the Viking and Norse sites on the Faroe Islands. The world's northern most volcanic island, Jan Mayen, is our next stop. This 14-day voyage ends with two days for exploring Spitsbergen, always on the lookout for polar bears.

Three Arctic Islands: Iceland, Greenland and Spitsbergen

You'll start this trip in cosmopolitan Reykjavik, Iceland, before heading to the eastern coast of Greenland to visit ancient Thule settlements and look for grazing muskoxen. Then it's on to Norway via Spitsbergen, the largest island in the Svalbard archipelago, which is abundant in wildlife (walrus, polar bears and reindeer), as well as spectacular glacier fronts and steep-walled fjords. Seeing calving glaciers for the first time is an unforgettable memory.

These two captivating archipelagos offer up breathtaking views of pristine wilderness, calving glaciers and rugged shorelines, some of the richest history of polar expedition, and iconic wildlife such as walrus, whales, seabirds and polar bears.
