Monemvasia, Greece – This medieval castle town, on an island east of the Peloponnese, is impressively carved into a large rocky plateau. 

DAY 1 • ATHENS, GREECE

DAY 7 • PATMOS, GREECE

Inhale the scent of heather and pines on the sacred island where the Book of Revelation was said to have been written. This UNESCO World Heritage Site draws pilgrims to sites like the Cave of the Apocalypse and the Holy Monastery of the Apocalypse, while nature lovers flock to the beaches.

DAY 8 • SANTORINI, GREECE

Cruise into Santorini, a vision in whitewash, volcanic black, and a blue so distinctive it's become known as Santorini blue. People of the Cyclades don't simply like the color, they believe it keeps away evil, a job it must do extremely well as it's hard to imagine a more sublime place. Catch iconic photos of traditional Greek windmills, and don't miss the romantic village of Oia with its cave houses.

DAY 9 · MONEMVASIA, GREECE

Monemvasia is a place where only the determined go, or those with private ships.

(Don't be surprised if yours is the only one in the harbor.) The Gibraltar-like fortress is linked to the rest of the Peloponnese by a thin tendril of causeway that was once a drawbridge, restricting access to whoever currently occupied the rock. Climb to the upper town and explore the citadel and Agia Sofia church. With no cars allowed, you can hear the cicadas singing and the sea breaking gently on the shore. Return to the lower town and sink into a welcome chair at a trattoria for a congratulatory sip of Malmsey, the sweet wine that originated here.

DAY 10 • NAFPLIO, GREECE

This charming seaside town is one of the most romantic cities in Greece. Enjoy the medieval old town with its narrow cobblestone alleys and neoclassical mansions. Take an optional tour to the UNESCO site of Epidaurus or the UNESCO site of Mycenea. Or stroll the Syntagma Square and take in the beauty of the Palamidi Castle with its 999 steps carved from the rocks.

DAY 11 • PIRAEUS (ATHENS), GREECE

Return to Athens, a city with 3,000 years of history where you can't turn around without encountering the past.

DAY 1 • CIVITAVECCHIA (ROME), ITALY

Devour (or at least taste) 2,000 years of history: Stones brought to life by Michelangelo, the clash of ghostly gladiators in the Colosseum, the treasures of the Vatican. *Molto bello!*

DAY 5 • KOTOR, MONTENEGRO

The approach to Kotor offers one breathtaking fjord-like view after another. Just when you've reached your fill of blues and greens, the bright red rooftops of the medieval Old Town — a UNESCO World Heritage Site — come into view. DAY 6 • DUBROVNIK, CROATIA

Franciscan Monastery, still operating after 700 years with dusty medieval remedies still lining the shelves.

DAY 7 • SPLIT, CROATIA

When Roman Emperor Diocletian decided to retire, he chose a spot that offered the best of both worlds — a beautifully scenic resort setting, and proximity to the urban pleasures of ancient Salona. The setting is still spectacular, and his palace, now a UNESCO site, is the fabric upon which the city grew. Beyond, you can go people-watching along Split's popular Riva promenade, wander the pedestrian boulevard of Marmontova Street, or rub the toe of the statue of Gregory of Nin for good luck. Further afield, there's dramatic Krka National Park with its spellbinding landscapes of gorges, lakes, and waterfalls.

DAY 8 • ROVINJ, CROATIA

Rovinj used to be a tiny island until the channel was filled in during the 18th century, so while the red terracotta roofs now spill inland, the Old Town is tidily self-contained. Hints of Italy are everywhere — in the signs, in the language, in the cuisine — thanks to having spent more than 500 years under Venetian rule. Seek out nearby Pula, a UNESCO World Heritage Site known for its ancient Roman buildings. Or the resort town of Porec with its 6th century Euphrasian Basilica, yet another UNESCO World Heritage Site.

DAY 9 • VENICE, ITALY

No other sea approach in the Adriatic raises goose bumps like Venice, where the entire city and its lagoon are a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Say farewell to your yacht and follow your private tour guide to Palace Bonvecchiati, a 4-star hotel just a stone's throw from St. Mark's Square. The hotel has been welcoming guests since 1790, and offers an upscale boutique hotel experience with contemporary comforts. Spend the afternoon at your leisure before a guided walking tour of St. Mark's Square and the Rialto area, the perfect place to enjoy an Aperitivo.

This region was the setting for most of the Icelandic sagas and you'll learn some folk tales as you view the short, fierce rapids of Barnafoss Waterfall and the series of rivulets that form Hraunfossar Waterfall. After lunch, step into the dazzling, blue-hued Langjökull Ice Tunnels and marvel at the natural beauty of one of the most striking glacier caves in Iceland. Enjoy a 3-course dinner at your hotel before retiring.

DAY 3 • PINGVELLIR NATIONAL PARK, STOKKSEYRI

Explore remarkable Pingvellir National Park after breakfast. This UNESCO World Heritage Site is where the world's oldest democratic parliament was founded in 930, and is also where the North American and Eurasian tectonic plates meet. Because of this unique geography, Iceland has magma close to the surface — one of the criteria required to produce geysers. See this in action at nearby Strokkur Geyser

before lunch. Next up is Pingvellir, Gullfoss, Geysir falls — together they are known as the Golden Circle. Travel to the small village of Fludir, home to the Secret Lagoon natural hot springs, then to the village of Stokkseyri for a dinner of local dishes before heading back to Reykjavik and The Grand Hotel.

DAY 4 • REYKJAVIK TO THE YACHT, BLUE LAGOON

Breakfast at the hotel before seeing the sights of Reykjavik. Experience the Iceland of the past at the Open-Air Museum at Arbaer, take in panoramic views of the city from Perlan planetarium's observation deck and admire the skyline-dominating tower of Hallgrimskirkja church. Wrap up the day with an iconic experience — bathing in the famous Blue Lagoon — before heading to your waiting yacht.

DAY 5 • HEIMAEY ISLAND, ICELAND

Witness a world still in transition as we explore two lands — one created by a volcanic eruption and one nearly destroyed by one. As we circle Surtsey Island, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, you'll get to see one of the newest islands on the

planet. Surtsey rose from the sea in the 1960s and offers a unique opportunity to study how species colonize a virgin land. Next up, Heimaey Island. Back in 1973, Eldfell Volcano erupted without warning, swallowing much of the main town and turning the rest into a modern-day Pompeii.

DAYS 6/7 • SEYDISFJORDUR, ICELAND (OVERNIGHT)

Wind your way up the 11 mile-long Seydisfjord, a narrow, beautiful waterway surrounded by high mountains. At the head of the fjord is Seydisfjordur, a small, scenic town where cascading waterfalls seem to be everywhere. During our overnight stay you'll have time to enjoy this beautiful part of the country and its unusual claims to fame, including a lake with a mythical "Ness" and Iceland's largest national forest. Bird watchers won't want to miss Skalanes Nature Reserve with its more than 45 bird species. Trekkers can make their way to spectacular Hengifoss Waterfall. Or simply stroll the quaint town of 700 with its colorful Norwegian kit-houses shipped in at the turn of the century.

DAY 8 • AKUREYRI, ICELAND

Akureyri nestles like a gem at the head of Iceland's longest fjord. It's just a stone's throw from the Arctic Circle, yet it offers some of Iceland's warmest weather and a rare ice-free harbor. It's due to this strange

geographic quirk that the town became a famous trading center under the Danes, and also accounts for the town possessing one of the northernmost botanical gardens in the world with a greenhouse that's geothermically heated. Spend your day riding an Icelandic Horse across the Icelandic countryside, or go for a soak in the sky-blue Myvatn Nature Baths.

DAY 9 • ISAFJORDUR, ICELAND

A breathtaking journey up Ísafjaroardjúp Bay precedes our arrival in Isafjordur, surprisingly urbane for a village of 2,600. Old Town's 19th century buildings take you back to the days of the tall ships, while the abandoned town of Hesteyri remains frozen in the 1940s. This is another great port for bird watchers as Vigur Island is teeming with puffins, eiders, guillemots, and Arctic terns.

DAY 10 • GRUNDARFJORDUR, ICELAND


Viking sagas come to life here, as does Jules Verne's tale Journey to the Centre of the Earth. You may share the inspiration to set pen to paper, but don't feel bad if words fail you. The views defy description.

DAY 11 • REYKJAVIK, ICELAND

Disembark back in Reykjavik with its surprisingly vibrant local museum and art scene.

DAY 5 • KAGOSHIMA, JAPAN

This castle town with its signature Sakurajima Volcano dates to the 14th century. Time-travel back to the days of the samurai in Chiran's picturesque samurai district, its views unsullied by telephone poles or parked cars. Go "sand bathing" in the naturally heated sands of Ibusuki.

DAY 6 • SCENIC CRUISING HASHIMA ISLAND/NAGASAKI

Cruise around the island of Hashima, abandoned over 50 years ago when the coal mining that flourished there suddenly ran out. The mining company shut the mine down and the island has been a ghost town ever since.

DAY 7 • BUSAN, SOUTH KOREA

Hot springs, 1,500-year-old Tongdosa Temple, and the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Gyeongju — once the capital of the Shila Kingdom — are just a few highlights of South Korea's second-largest city. For something different, visit Gamcheon Culture Village where terraced homes pour over the slopes like a rainbow-hued waterfall.

DAY 8 • KARATSU, JAPAN

Located on the island of Kyushu, Karatsu is one of the closest Japanese cities to the Korean Peninsula. Karatsu Castle is the main attraction here. Built in 1608, it houses a museum of the castle's history and Karatsu ceramics. Karatsu is also known for its pottery which can be viewed at the Karatsuyaki Pottery Gallery. Also worth visiting is the Karatsu Hikiyama Exhibition Hall which displays the 14 floats used in the annual Karatsu Kunchi Festival in November.

DAY 9 · HIROSHIMA, JAPAN

Fold a paper crane to leave at the Atomic Dome, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and visit Hiroshima Castle to see three trees that survived the bombing that destroyed the castle itself. Or head to Miyajima, one of the most scenic spots in Japan, for a look at the vermilion Itsukushima Shrine floating in the sea — yet another World Heritage Site.

DAY 10 • TAKAMATSU, JAPAN

The main gateway to Shikoku Island and an important focal point for the island's rail and road transit systems, Takamatsu, on Japan's scenic Inland Sea, has been a political and economic center since the Edo period. Among the attractions here is Ritsurin Garden, created during the Edo period, and especially popular during spring for the cherry blossoms and autumn for the fall foliage. Takamatsu Symbol Tower has several observation decks providing panoramic views of the sea and landscapes.

DAY 11 • KOBE, JAPAN

Kobe is the 6th largest city in Japan and famous for its signature marbled beef. The Ikuta Shrine there is among Japan's oldest shrines, dating back to the 3rd century. Kobe is also the gateway to Mount Rokko, accessible by antique cable car, and the outdoor hot springs of Arima Onsen. Other sites include the Sake Brewery, the Earthquake Museum, and Sorakuen Garden.

(Includes overnight at Intercontinental Osaka and lunch.)

DAY 12 • KYOTO, JAPAN

Two more UNESCO World Heritage Sites are included today. Kinkaku-ji (the Golden Pavilion) shines even on an overcast day with its gold leaf exterior. Back in Japan's feudal era, nearby Nijo Castle housed the visiting shogun, protected by an ancient security system known as "nightingale floors" that squeak if intruders approach. End the day at a local machiya (townhouse) in Kyoto where you can try on a kimono as you learn their history and attend a traditional tea ceremony.



Follow ice debris up stunningly beautiful Tracy Arm, a fjord that terminates at the twin Sawyer Glaciers. Sheer mountain peaks loom above you and waterfalls stream off the rocky cliffs. Mountain goats look down from above and harbor seals with their pups watch from ice floes below. Our small ship is much more maneuverable than larger ships, giving us a better chance of reaching all the way up the passage. When weather and ice conditions permit, we'll watch ice calve off the glacier's face. If ice blocks Tracy Arm, we'll cruise the broader Endicott Arm with similar scenery.

DAY 8 • SITKA, ALASKA

This humble port city was once the capital of Russian America, and was where the official transfer of Alaska took place in 1867. Explore the Russian and Tlingit cultures that influenced its growth, capture an iconic photo of the Russian Orthodox church, or head to the Alaska Raptor Center for a close-up look at bald eagles and other birds of prey.

DAY 9 • MISTY FJORDS, ALASKA

John Muir first viewed Misty Fjords by cedar canoe, comparing it to his beloved Yosemite. And today it looks much as it did back then, one of the last places on earth where you can explore vast swaths of rugged, remote area untouched by humans. With silt-blue lakes, silvery waterfalls, and snowcapped peaks, you'll get a postcard picture literally everywhere you turn, depending on the weather of course. DAY 10 • KETCHIKAN, ALASKA
